Highways, 04/04/2019:

Hi Meg

Thank you for your email. Technically it would be possible to implement a waiting restriction at this junction. I have to be honest it is not a location where I have observed any inappropriate parking so we will require some evidence of the issues that are occurring. I will add this one to my list of sites to visit.

As always there is a downside, the cost of a Traffic Regulation Order is approximately £10k and the legal process takes about 12 months from start to finish.
