Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP)

The final version of the NDP has now been submitted to the Forest of Dean District Council who must submit this for a 6 week consultation under Regulation 16. An examiner has been selected and we are awaiting details of a pre-examination meeting. Final examination will not occur until after the consultation period is complete.

It is anticipated that some changes may be requested by the examiner and once these have been agreed by all parties the updates will be included into the document.

The last stage before acceptance and inclusion into the planning regulations will be a referendum of Alvington residents organised by the District Council.

It is important that as many residents as possible vote at this referendum when it is issued!

Alvington Celebrates Summer Fun Day

For the first time in recent years, Alvington came together on the 30th June to celebrate a village fun day. With Court Lane decorated with bunting to guide villagers to the Sports Field, large numbers gathered to take part in games, share a drink and help raise money towards our new pavilion.

The organising committee were delighted to see all of Alvington coming together, with the Swan Tea Rooms providing scones, the Blacksmiths Arms running a bar, the Globe contributing raffle prizes, the WI selling cakes, the memorial hall loaning tables, chairs and its bouncy



castle, local craftsmen and women selling their wares and the cricket team hosting a Twenty20 against former members from the village. Following the tightly fought match the pitch was opened for anyone to try their hand bowling.



The Fun Day also welcomed all children with a free raffle ticket to be the lucky ribbon-cutter on the new play equipment. This had been successfully installed in time for the Fun Day, with Nick Powell and Chris Shill working with Councillors to spruce up the existing trim trail so all our play equipment was in top-form ready for the Fun Day. Our lucky winner cut the red ribbon and declared the play equipment officially open.

Our new District Councillor, Chris McFarling, joined us to officiate on the children's fancy-dress competition, awarding prizes for first and second places. Chris admitted it was a daunting task choosing between so many good costumes. Many thanks to parents and kids for a strong showing. Keep it up for next year!





Overall we raised an invaluable £900 towards the pavilion, which has allowed us to submit our planning application, and move onto the next stage of the project. The village also acquired a 6mx3m marquee and two camping toilets, which we now hold as assets. These can be hired at reasonable rates for garden parties and other events. The event was a real success, with many villagers asking for it to be repeated next year. Alvington & Woolaston Cricket Club Win Promotion to Division 1

At the end of 2018 you would have been excused for thinking that the future of Alvington and Woolaston Cricket Club (formed in 1984) was an uncertain one. Despite the picturesque setting near the banks of the River Severn, a number of players had left in the previous 12 months, and the facilities had for decades been very basic.

They had finished bottom of Division 2 West of the Cheltenham Gloucester and Forest league with only 2 wins in 15 games. Yet this wasn't a team in hopeless decline. Their Chairman, Nick Powell, was tirelessly committed to the cause of rebuilding, both on and off the field. He had already been working with the Parish Council and the Sports Field Committee for some time on a plan for a superb new multi-purpose Sports Pavilion for the community to be sited at the ground. During last winter he and the new Captain worked hard to recruit new players and attracted past local players to return to the game. This year these players became a team, united in a belief of wanting to play for the Club and within the spirit of cricket that is the particular hallmark of the game.

It proved to be an irresistible force for change. In one season of 16 games, bottom of the table became top and with it promotion to Division 1 with 13 wins. Long serving and new players took 3 places in the top 10 for batting in the league, 5 for bowling and 6 for fielding. An all round great achievement for everyone involved with the Club. New players and supporters who love the game and support the place of village cricket in the local community are always welcome. The Sports Pavilion plans are complete and have been submitted to planning at the District Council.

For all the right reasons, they are now a team looking forward to the future.

Our CONGRATULATIONS to the TEAM on a fantastic result.
