However, he has also raised a job to cut back the soil at the rear of the path for a total distance of approximately 165 metres, and this will be completed at the earliest opportunity." Sept 2021: a very small amount of work seems to have taken place, but it's far from addressing the issues. In mid-September I sent a pack of information/photos to Highways to illustrate the issue.
